MILTON MAN MISSING

Mr. and Mrs. Charles Hodges, of 55, Union road, Milton Regis, have received the news that their only son, Pte. John Hodges, of The Buffs, is reported missing. Pte. Hodges, who was a single man of 35 years of age, enlisted under the Derby Group system, and in due course answered his call. Previous to this time he had been employed by the Trustees of the Hinde Estate. He had served nearly two years in the Sherwood Foresters, and had previously been wounded. He returned to France last July, and was soon in the thickest of the fighting round Ypres. The last communication was received from him on September 23rd last, and now he has been officially listed as missing.
