

## MEMORIAL SERVICE

A special memorial service for those lads in Trinity parish who have made the supreme sacrifice was held in Holy Trinity Church, Sittingbourne, on Tuesday evening, conducted by the Vicar (the Rev. J. C. Eyre Kidson). The relatives and friends of Private Warner present were Mrs. Coleman (aunt), Mrs. Wenban (aunt), Mr. and Mrs. F. Payne (Gillingham) (aunt and uncle), Mrs. Carr, Miss Rayercraft, Mr. E. F. White, Mr. and Mrs. W. J. Pullen, Mr. and Mrs. Herbert Pullen, and the Misses Blackman. Several relatives of other gallant young soldiers who have fallen on the battlefield were also present. The service commenced with the singing of the hymn, "Jesus lives! no longer now Can thy terrors Death appal us," followed by the General Confession and the Lord's Prayer, Psalm 46, and the reading of a portion of Scripture (1st Thessalonians, iv. 13 to the end). After reciting the Creed, the hymn, "On the Resurrection morning" was sung. In the course of the prayers which followed, the Vicar said: "Let us commend to the safe keeping of God the souls of our dear brothers who have given their lives in the sacred cause of Liberty and Right."
